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
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

Solving a problem: what a DBA is ultimately about!

If you are wondering whether a DBA journey is the right thing for you, you need to read what follows!

A DBA research and dissertation is an incredible experience that enables you to establish a bridge between two worlds: the world of business and the world of research.

How is that so?

At Business School Lausanne, we consider that every DBA research and dissertation aims to enable you to transform business while advancing academic research at the same time.

In other words, the objective of every DBA research lies within a transformative contribution to your industry on a two-fold level: the level of business and the level of academic production through research done in the area of business administration related to your research topic.

What is special about the problem you want to solve?

Every DBA journey should start with a problem that you have identified in your professional environment and practice and that you want to solve. This problem can be of any nature related to business administration.

What makes solving this problem different from a consulting practice, is that within a DBA research you will have to make an advancement of the theory that will lead to or is caused by a transformation of business on an operational or a strategic level.

Your research will attempt to offer a solution at the academic level of your business

problem. For example, it may be a new problem or a problem that no one has ever seen before, or the solution which exists does not lead to the expected results and could be improved, or the solution is not able to solve the problem anymore.

The DBA research is also different in terms of problem-solving from the consulting practice because we do not want you just to **imagine** new solutions to apply from which you think that they might work to solve the problem you have identified.

We want you to **validate** the solutions and collect data in the field with a scientific methodology, regarding the proposed solution to the problem, so that your solution becomes backed with academic rigor.

Sometimes the problem is evident and easy to identify. Sometimes it is blurry, complex and intricate. Sometimes the problem is restricted to one research field. Sometimes the problem has multi-disciplinary aspects. Sometimes the problem comes from a change of paradigm. Sometimes the problem has been addressed many times already but with a non-satisfactory solution, and sometimes the problem you think you have identified is not the problem you will end up solving in your DBA journey.

The two key ideas to remember are that: the starting point of every DBA journey lies within the identification of a problem, and the problem you may have identified is not necessarily the problem you will end up solving in your research.


So why is the problem you have identified, not necessarily the problem you will end up solving?

Because the second and central component of your DBA journey is related to the level on which you are going to solve the problem you have identified.

This level is the level of the advancement of theory and academic research. You will not solve the problem you have identified from a consulting perspective, staying at the level of your business or company in terms of impact. You will solve the problem on a larger scale, contributing to transforming the theory, and thus having an impact on your industry, and not a on a specific company.

And this is also where your researcher's journey starts.

As a Doctoral journey aims to contribute to the advancement of theory, you need to find a gap in the existing academic theory. This gap can consist of a blind spot, for example, or of partial research done on the business topic related to the problem you want to solve.

DBA thesis versus Ph.D. thesis

The DBA research bridges the gap between the academic need for advancement of theory at the level of Doctoral studies and the actual transformation of the business world. In this respect, DBA research is very different from the Ph.D. research, which stays at the level of the advancement of the theory only, most of the time.

Therefore, you will have to make sure that your doctoral journey digs into the existing literature to see how the problem has been addressed or analyzed on an academic level so far.

What can you expect to do in the course of your research?

Once you have identified a gap in theory that is related to the problem you want to solve, you can use different research methodologies that you will discover and learn to master throughout your DBA journey, to fill that gap with a new piece of academic research.

This way you will, at the same time, contribute to solving a business problem and advancing theory.

A DBA journey leading to the writing of a Doctoral dissertation is not a linear process and is difficult to time precisely.

Your journey starts with the first piece of your dissertation, the literature review, showing that you master and can challenge and question the current state of academic theory.

Based on the literature review and on the gaps you have identified in the theory, you will be able to select the methodologies (qualitative and/or quantitative) that can help you fill the theoretical gap and develop a new solution that will be of a transformative nature for your industry.

Following the literature review, the case study methodology most commonly used at BSL, (as a first step to get back to the business problem you want to solve), enables you to conduct action research in the field and within your industry.

The findings of your first case study will then lead you to choose a research methodology to either confirm your findings or dig into another direction.

The results you get from your research and the help of your supervisor guide you constantly towards the next steps of your researcher's journey and ultimately to the successful completion of your DBA thesis.

The difference the advancement of theory makes

It is very important to understand that the results of your research are going to constitute your findings and that these findings are going to be the central part of your thesis dissertation.

Your findings will either validate or invalidate the solution you think should be applied to the problem you identified when starting your researcher's journey.

That is how you become a researcher! You do not presuppose the solution:

You humbly look for the solution having a starting point in mind.

You are ready to challenge your intuition and your assumptions.

You are prepared for the fact that your findings might contradict your beliefs on how to solve the problem.

Throughout your Doctoral journey, you will become a game-changer in your industry, as well as an accomplished academic.

Self-Paced Learning Approach



You will also find guidance navigating the BSL thesis guidelines and the different phases of your Doctoral journey.

Pillar 3 : DBA Acceleration Weeks Our BSL Signature Support

The goal of the DBA Acceleration Weeks (DAW) is to help you accelerate the progress of your doctoral studies and work towards meeting the deadlines set for the completion of your Doctoral program.

The acceleration weeks take place twice every year, once in Spring and again in Autumn. There are non-mandatory but highly recommended and are included in the DBA tuition fees.

During those weeks that take place every 6 months, you will be invited to take part in three different formats :

1. Lectures by Faculty (ex: lecture topics related to research and research methodology, qualitative research, quantitative research, mixed methods, research design)
 2. Presentation sessions by students on the different phases of the DBA research journey they are completing (ex: presentation of literature review) and
 3. Workshops (ex: academic writing).

The DAWs will help you solve problems in the following areas:

- Thinking and reasoning
 - Research methodology
 - Academic writing and the writing process
 - Communication and academic presentation skills
 - DBA work-life balance related questions
 - Continuous alignment of your research and your business goal
 - Personal and professional development

DAWs are a unique opportunity for you to work on your thesis in an international academic environment whilst accelerating your academic thinking skills and writing proficiency as well as receiving feedback on the state of your work in a 6 months cycle.

BSL has selected world-class learning and research tools to help you accomplish your research related tasks faster and with more satisfying results. Thanks to this environment, you will be able to:

The Doctoral Program

Duration

The duration of the program is generally 3 years, however, there is a possibility of extending this up to a total of 6 years, depending on the area of studies and your vocational commitments.

Course Work

During your time of study, you will have access to a number of BSL resources and your course work will include the following:

- Two, non-mandatory, one-week seminars per year (DBA Acceleration Weeks – DAWs)
 - Individually supervised research with a supervisor with both academic and professional experience
 - Continuous support from the BSL Doctoral School team.
 - Access to the Doctoral School Resource Center.

Academic Calendar

The BSL DBA program has four intakes per year: February, May, September and November.

Phasing

PHASE 1 / ADMISSION



At BSL, our admissions team provide comprehensive support in the submission of your application. The primary purpose of which is to provide you with guidance and advice on your personal capacity to embark on your DBA journey.

Aside from the administrative tasks required for acceptance on to the program, the admission process incorporates a letter of intent and a preliminary research topic proposal. This first step will help you define and explain your area of interest and focus for your research.

To address the personal needs of each candidate, BSL offers two tracks to be accepted to the Doctoral Program:

Track 1 - Direct Application

You have a well-defined topic and are ready to submit it for further review. You will work directly with our Admissions team on completing your application.

Track 2 - Faculty Led Workshop

You have not identified a research topic but have an idea of a business problem impacting your industry and feel that you would benefit from more academic support to design your Research Topic. In which case, we offer a faculty lead workshop in which you will have four-one hour meetings over a period of three months

with one of our faculty to help you in completing your Research Topic Proposal.

Once you have submitted your completed application and Research Topic, a preliminary review will be rendered and an acceptance decision will be provided to you. A preliminary admission means that your research topic has been accepted and the Doctoral School has initiated the selection of an appropriate faculty supervisor.

2 PHASE 2 / DEFINING YOUR RESEARCH QUESTION

(estimated duration under optimal conditions: 18 months)

Once fully accepted to the program, a DBA consultancy session will be held with the Director of the Doctoral School, in order to shape the first step of the research process.

This will allow you to contextualize the ways in which BSL will assist you in reaching your desired research aims and program objectives. Following this consultancy session, a faculty supervisor will be appointed to you.

During Phase 2, in collaboration with your supervisor, you will work on and will be required to submit a literature review along with a first assignment based most-likely on a case study. Both the literature review and the case study should be developed around the foundations of your preliminary research proposal.

During this phase, the match between you and your assigned supervisor is assessed. If the literature review and/or case study lead to a research question demanding an unexpected field of expertise, our program is sufficiently flexible to allow for a new or additional supervisor to be assigned to you.

3 PHASE 3 / RESEARCH PROPOSAL

Your literature review and case study will be presented to and subsequently discussed in collaboration with the supervisor and the Doctoral School Executive. This provides a final validation of your research question and allows you to prepare for the next step of your research.

The presentation can be made in person at the BSL campus or, if you are unable to attend in person, via an online platform.

After a validation of your research question, research process and results a DBA thesis action plan will be determined with you to prepare you for Phase 4 which includes the continuation of the writing of your DBA thesis dissertation.

4 PHASE 4 / WRITING YOUR THESIS

(estimated duration under optimal conditions: 18 months)

Your DBA dissertation, centered on the research carried out throughout the program, is the primary piece of work that will be assessed for the eventual awarding of the Doctoral degree.

The Doctoral Program

In accordance with your supervisor, a progression plan will be defined to ensure the completion of your thesis dissertation.

During phase 4 of your Doctoral program regular feedback, support and progression monitoring will be provided in order to make sure that you have the appropriate guidance during the writing process, whilst simultaneously ensuring the timely completion of the thesis. Your dissertation will also include a revised literature review.

5 PHASE 5 / ORAL DEFENSE

The Viva Voce should take place in person on campus; live video examination may take place in case of force majeure.

The thesis is assessed by a minimum of two appropriately qualified examiners, who hold a doctoral-level research degree.

6 PHASE 6 / PUBLICATION


Your DBA dissertation is published on the BSL repository once completed.

During the course of your Doctoral program, you will also have the possibility to publish scientific articles with the support of your supervisor.




The Doctoral Program

Admission Process

Admission Requirements

The DBA is intended for individuals that hold an E/MBA or a Masters-level degree in management or a related field, along with those who have an equivalent professional qualification. The profile of Doctoral Candidates are mature and experienced leaders who demonstrate the potential to meet the learning and research requirements of the DBA.

In general, students are expected to have a minimum of eight years professional experience prior to their DBA studies. In exceptional cases, candidates holding a minimum of five years of management experience may be considered. A significant portion of this experience should be at a senior level.

Am I eligible?

The requirements for eligibility to apply are:

- Hold an E/MBA or Masters degree in a business faculty or management fields
- Display evidence of the potential to do doctoral level work through the submission of a research topic
- Hold at least eight years' of professional experience (case-by-case assessment is possible for the number of years of professional experience) and hold at least one of the following:
 - Be working in a professional capacity with significant responsibility **OR**
 - Be hold a senior management role **OR**
 - Be the managing director/chief executive officer of a small and medium-sized enterprise or C-Suite executive or equivalent position **OR**
 - Be pursuing, or have pursued, a significant career in a professional or business area that falls within the research interests of Business transformation
- Proof of English Proficiency

Application Deadlines

BSL offers twenty places per year in the DBA program. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis, up to one year prior to the selected intake.

We always recommend applying as soon as possible to ensure a seat in the program.

September intake - July 31st

February intake - January 31st

November intake - October 31st

May intake - April 30th

Admission Process

Checklist

The BSL Admissions Committee only review complete applications. However we offer comprehensive support to help you build a strong application during this process.

Review the Admissions criteria

As soon as you have decided that BSL is the right business school for you, please carefully review the admission criteria to confirm your eligibility. If you have not yet connected with your program advisor, you can reach us directly admissions@bsl-lausanne.ch.

To complete your application **OR** Register for the workshop you must submit the following:

- A complete Application Form
- Letter of Intent outlining your research interests (Page 1 and 2 of the topic proposal template)

OR

A completed Research Topic Proposal for the Direct Application Track
- Updated Curriculum Vitae
- One Recommendation Letter

Evidence of academic achievements (1 academic reference + master thesis) or Evidence of professional proficiency (1 general reference letter)
- Official Transcripts and copy of your College/University degree

Foreign Official Transcripts must be certified by a legal authority such as a public notary, with translation when necessary. Official Transcripts can be submitted electronically to admissions@bsl-lausanne.ch or by post to the Office of Admissions: Route de la Maladière 21, 1022 Chavannes – Switzerland
- Proof of English proficiency (*only one test necessary*)

Minimum requirements:
 - TOEFL IBT 90
 - TOEFL CBT 575
 - IELTS 6.5
 - TOEIC 800
 - Duolingo 110
 - Language Cert - Low C1 (Expert Level)
- Copy of your Passport of Government Issued I.D.
- A digital portrait photograph
- An application Fee of 120 CHF, payable online. The application fee is payable once and will not be charged later on again when you articulate into the DBA.

Program Fees

The Doctorate in Business Administration (DBA) costs 14'000 CHF per year.

The Faculty Led Workshop costs 2'000 CHF.

Candidates articulating onto the BSL DBA program at the end of the Faculty Led workshop, receive a one-time 1'000 CHF discount toward the first year DBA tuition fee.

An additional administrative fee of 1'900 CHF is required to reserve a seat and is payable upon preliminary acceptance.

If you are a Swiss resident and you pay your taxes in Switzerland, you may be allowed to partially deduct your tuition fees from your taxable income. The rules are different in each canton. We advise you to check this with the fiscal authorities of the canton you live in.




Rankings, Memberships, Certifications & Accreditation

Accreditation

The business programs at Business School Lausanne are accredited by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP), an accreditation organization for business education officially recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). The ACBSP accreditation covers business programs from approximately 2'400 higher education institutions internationally. In the United States, CHEA is officially entitled to list accredited programs, including those at Business School Lausanne.

In Europe, each country has set up its own national academic information center (NARIC), which lists officially recognized institutions within a particular country. In Switzerland, the Swiss CRUS (Rectors' Conference of Swiss Universities, a state-owned institution) currently lists only Swiss state-owned universities. Thus, leading private institutions such as Business School Lausanne are not included. It should be noted that BSL is listed in the U.S. National Academic Recognition Information Center through CHEA.



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
